Topic: We have enjoyed the first week of our new topic 'Long Ago'. Next week we will carry on exploring black and white photographs and looking at pictures from the past. Our focus text is 'Rosie's Hat' by Julia Donaldson. We will be making our own hats for a windy day! We will concentrate on the part of the story where Rosie grows and thinks about how we are all growing and getting older. We will also be focusing on the vocabulary in the story and repeating rhymes.

Next week to support our topic we will also be having some special visits from some babies and young children to talk about how we grow and change.

How can you help your child at home -

- Discuss with the children different books you may have read when you were a child, read stories together.
- Explore old pictures of grandparents when they were young.
- Look at pictures of when your children were babies and talk about how they have grown up.

Maths: Next week we will be working on subitising the number three. Subitising helps children to see, solve and manipulate numbers in their head. This develops their number sense and helps them master key calculations at an early stage.

We have loved being back and sharing snack time with our friends. It has been fun taking turns to be the snack monitor. We have loved meeting new friends!




