How can you help your child at home -


- Discuss with the children different books you may have read when you were a child, read stories together.

- Look at pictures of when your children were babies and talk about how they have grown up.

Maths: Next week we will be working on subitising the number four. Subitising helps children to see, solve and manipulate numbers in their head. This develops their number sense and helps them master key calculations at an early stage.
