


We have enjoyed exploring our 'Season Tree' and making it look like our favourite season.




We were great at finding sounds on the ground and mark making.

Our peas and turnips have got so big! We will be bringing home our peas next week, they can be planted in a container or put straight into the ground.












Thelma amazed everyone by defying gravity, we think she was pretending to be Spiderman!
