Topic:

Next term we will start our new topic 'Ready, Steady, Grow'

This project teaches children about food and farming and explores themes, including where food comes from, what plants and animals need to grow and survive and what constitutes a healthy lifestyle.

Our first book we will be reading is 'The Gigantic Turnip', we will be thinking about how we would grow a turnip but also thinking about the message of working as a team to get things done.

How can you help your child at home –

- Talk about growing vegetables and plants, spend some time tidying and exploring your garden or some outdoor space.
- Look at different vegetables and talk about how and where they grow.
- Eat a new vegetable.

Maths: In Maths we will be recapping our numbers and also thinking about the number 6 in the first week back. Next term we will also explore measure such as height, weight and volume. We will also be exploring more and less.

We have enjoyed exploring all the areas in the classroom and really love our visits to the library.




