Our new topic is 'Ready, Steady, Grow': - in this project your child will take part in practical activities to explore where food comes from. They will learn what seeds and plants need to grow and they will grow a variety of plants.

Our focus book next week is 'Oliver's Vegetables'.

How you can support your child at home:

- Share books about gardening or vegetables.
- Visit a local green grocer or supermarket and talk about the various vegetables.
- Plant some vegetable seeds and take care of a plant together.

Maths- In Maths we will be consolidating our prior learning, with a focus on 'length, height and time, doubles, counting and shape.

How to support your child at home:

- Have fun measuring or putting things in height or length order.
- Talk about your daily routine, with a focus on the time on which you do these things.
