We would like photos or a pictures of the children with their grandparents or a special adults. Please send these into school on Monday.


How you can support your child at home:

How to support your child at home:

- Bake a cake and talk about weight, e.g. heavy, light, heavier and lighter.
- Get some containers and fill them with water or pasta, encouraging the correct vocabulary, such as empty, full, half full, nearly full and nearly empty.
- Use various opportunities around the house to talk about mass and capacity.


The children had great fun talking about their memories and what they are proud of.
