Headteacher Message

This week marked the end of the first half of the Lent term—which has been an extremely busy one. The curriculum provided here at St Joseph's offers stimulating and challenging activities that encourage critical thinking, creativity, and collaboration. From practical projects to interactive lessons, our goal is to ignite a passion for learning in every child. This is something that you will witness here every day and something that our Governors were able to observe on their visit on Wednesday.

The visit was based around the schools development plan to improve our school and the experiences for our pupils. Our key development points are acquiring and embedding foundational knowledge, engaging and responsive teaching to accelerate learning, developing Maths fluency and number sense/ recall for all pupils and supporting the mental health of our pupils in a world where this is threatened by so many factors.




