

#### Information

Overgrown Hedges—Update Received from Buckinghamshire Council

Please be advised that the overgrown hedges along the walkways outside of the school have been reported to the Council. Hopefully, they will be attended to shortly.

All wild birds are protected. This includes their nests (whilst in use or being built) as well as any eggs the nest may contain. Under the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), it is an offence to:

- intentionally kill, injure or take any wild bird
- intentionally damage, destroy or take the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built (nests of golden eagle, white tailed eagle and osprey are protected all year round)
- intentionally destroy an egg of any wild bird
- intentionally or recklessly disturb certain wild birds or their dependent young while they are nesting (including disturbance of nesting young)

Although no dates are legally stated between which hedges cannot be trimmed, cut, laid or coppiced, the main bird breeding season is recognised as being between 1 March and 31 July which we adhere to. Please note, if the issue reported is classified by our Highway Officer as an emergency, arrangements will be made to make the hedge safe for both road and pedestrian users in line with our <a href="Highways Safety Inspection Policy">Highways Safety Inspection Policy</a>.

#### Scooter and bicycles

Can we please remind all parents that children **MUST** dismount from cycles and scooters on entering the main school gate. ## Uniform Reminders

We would like to remind all parents that it is part of the teachers duties to monitor uniform and they will speak to children and parents where uniform is not adhered to. Unfortunately, this has been met with rudeness and aggressiveness recently—which is really disappointing given that this was the topic of the headteachers message a few weeks ago.

For clarification—our uniform policy relating to summer dresses is—

The option of a summer dress does not include culottes or gingham shorts and top set.

There seems to be a trend recently of wearing shorts under dresses, this is not part of our uniform and if the shorts are visible when children are standing we will ask them to remove them. If you wish your child to wear shorts underneath please ensure that they are not visible.

Please be reminded about acceptable hair cuts below:

On health and safety grounds, shoulder length hair and longer hair should be tied back neatly using bands in the school colours (white, dark green or black only).

Large hair rosettes and bows are not to be worn.

Pupils should not wear extreme hair fashions, these include dyed or streaked hair, close shaved hair (even under top layer of longer hair - undercut) and styles such as spikes, tufts, high tops, flat tops, Mohican haircuts and images or lines cut into the hair.

Children's hair length should be no shorter than a number two.

The use of hair gels, waxes, oils, mousses and any other styling products is not allowed. If we feel a hairstyle is unsuitable, we will ask for this to be rectified.

Socks—should be either ankle socks or knee high socks. Over the knee or trainer socks are not part of the school uniform.
