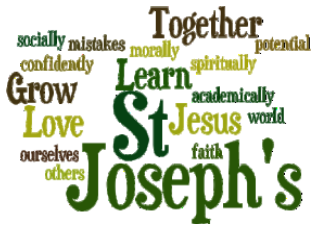

Headteacher Message

During this week's assembly, we reflected on our Lenten journey. Having passed the halfway point of our 40 days, we acknowledged that some of us may be finding it challenging to uphold our Lenten promises. We reminded ourselves that this journey is about deepening our relationship with God. Like the blind man in last week's Gospel, we are reminded that Jesus can transform our lives if we believe and have faith. As Pilgrims of Hope, we strive to devote time to nurturing our relationship with God, living His values, and sharing His message of love.

This message resonated beautifully in our 'Love, Learn, Grow' assembly this morning. It was heart-warming to see families of award recipients attending to celebrate and support their children's achievements. Watching these pupils accept their awards always fills me with admiration for their resilience, determination, and dedication to their learning. One of my favourite moments during the assembly is viewing the PowerPoint slides showcasing the incredible learning undertaken by each year group in recent months. The sheer volume of learning and the creative ways in which staff introduce new concepts never fail to astonish me.

For example, it was remarkable how Year 2 managed to "travel" to Spain via their classroom, complete with in-flight refreshments—it was a delightful experience! Meanwhile, Year 3 impressed us with their stained glass window creations in Forest School as part of their 'Light and Shadows' topic. These beautiful artworks have enhanced the area's charm and added to its vibrancy.

Before the term ends, every child will have the opportunity to visit the POD, our prayer space, to reflect and spend time with God. This serene area features the Stations of the Cross, allowing children to journey with Jesus during His final days on earth. It's a meaningful time to develop empathy and reflect on the actions and emotions of Jesus and those around Him during this poignant time.

Our Year 3 and Year 4 pupils know this story well and brought it to life during the Passion Play in church on Wednesday evening. Through their actions and scripture readings, they retold the story in a memorable and moving way. We are so grateful for the children's efforts in creating such a meaningful adaptation and for the staff's dedication in preparing them so wonderfully.

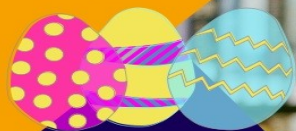

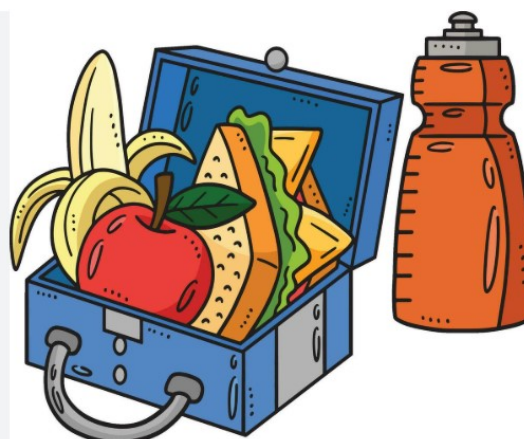
Curriculum Information
