

This week we had our Read Write Inc Development Day. This is a day that gives us the opportunity to work with a specialist advisor on ensuring the children receive expert teaching in this key area. It was wonderful to get such glowing feedback from her on the progress we have made in implementing this phonics scheme. The children, as ever, were fantastic in displaying their knowledge and superb behaviour for learning.

A special thank you to staff and children for taking us back in time and sharing their research on Chalfont St Peter, their local history project. I have loved looking at the old photographs and developing an understanding of life, as it was over 100 years ago. The museum will remain open on Monday from 2-3.30pm for parents and friends to observe and learn about the place they live.

Collecting children at the end of the school day.

Please be reminded to make contact with the class teacher at the end of the school day when collecting your child. If another adult is picking up your child they must have the password that you have provided. Our safeguarding assumes that if this adult has the password, you have given them permission to collect your child.

School Information

Phonics Screening Check Year 1

Next week all the children in Year 1 (and those in Year 2— who did not reach the expected standard in Yr1) will take the statutory Phonics Screening Check. The children have made fantastic progress this year with RWInc and we are really confident that they will do exceptionally well in the check. The children are used to having these assessments—as part of RWInc involves assessment every 6 weeks.

Over the weekend you may want to re-visit the section on the website for RWInc—this can be found under the Children's tab / Read Write Inc. In here, as you are aware from attending workshop events are numerous materials to help you support your child with their phonics knowledge.

This is not something for the children to feel anxious about - it simply involves them reading a set of 40 words.

Multiplication Timestables Check

Year 4 will undertake their MTC next week. As you will be aware from the workshop Mrs Fallon ran on this earlier in the year, this involves an on line assessment of 25 multiplication questions, similar to what the children have been doing as part of their Timestables Rockstars homework.

The assessment is completed on tablets and ipads in small groups of approx. 10 pupils.

The children will have the opportunity to do a practice assessment a day or two before they do the real thing, so they will be familiar with the process.

Over the weekend it may be worth a revisit of timestables with your child in preparation for this.

Water bottles

Please can you make sure that during hot weather children come to school with a named water bottle.

We have water dispensers in various areas of the school and the children will be able to refill their bottle at an appropriate time during the day. Please be reminded that the bottles should only contain water—juice is not permitted.

Uniform Reminders

With the warmer weather arriving there has been some huge variations in uniform. Please find below some important reminders and on the next page the full uniform requirements for school. Please remind yourselves of these, so that children are wearing the correct St. Joseph's uniform. Teachers duties include monitoring uniform and they will speak to children and parents where uniform is not adhered to.

A few points to highlight:

Children MUST have school shoes, trainers are not part of the uniform and should only be worn for PE lessons or Forest School.

The school fleece is an outdoor jacket—it does not replace the school jumper. If children are wearing a shirt they should also wear a school tie. Pupils can wear a logoed school polo shirt or a plain polo shirt—it is not essential, but preferable, to have polo shirts showing the school logo.

The option of a summer dress does not include culottes or gingham shorts and top set.

Summer hats can be either a school cap available at Earth Uniform, or a plain green cap.

Please be reminded about acceptable hair cuts below:

On health and safety grounds, shoulder length hair and longer hair should be tied back neatly using bands in the school colours (white, dark green or black only).

Large hair rosettes and bows are not to be worn.

Pupils should not wear extreme hair fashions, these include dyed or streaked hair, close shaved hair (even under top layer of longer hair - undercut) and styles such as spikes, tufts, high tops, flat tops, Mohican haircuts and images or lines cut into the hair.

Children's hair length should be no shorter than a number two.

The use of hair gels, waxes, oils, mousses and any other styling products is not allowed. If we feel a hairstyle is unsuitable, we will ask for this to be rectified.
